

Picture a Paragraph

Read a descriptive paragraph from a book to your child or student. Hand them colored pencils, crayons, or markers and a notepad, drawing pad, or typing paper and have them draw the descriptive paragraph. Make sure all words and phrases are understood so the child or student can draw.

You can also have them draw a picture and then write a story about the picture. So the picture should be as descriptive as possible.

This activity may also help reading comprehension along with writing skills.

Example:

The boy with the red hair, green eyes, and large ears was wearing a blue shirt, yellow pants, and red tennis shoes. He was at the park. The park had very green grass, many trees, 3 park benches, 2 swing sets, 1 small slide, 1 medium slide, and 1 large, windy slide. The boy was bouncing a big red ball with white stars on it and a blue stripe around the middle.

Have fun drawing this picture!
